

# ART, 6-12

We will create the following projects and touch upon some of the specific standards in art, but we will not be limited by a list. Some lessons take 2 class periods or more. We always have fantastic discussions about artists and or media in our lessons. We always use correct vocabulary for art. We try to achieve quality over quantities of work. Sometimes our list of projects is over planned, or we might change it a bit due to interest of the students, abilities, or time constraints. This is because of our focus on quality over quantity. 1. Students will be given practice or assignments for home. I will give students their assignments each week, I will post the assignment to Artbuggy Studio's facebook page, and I will email you the assignment. If they wish to improve their skills, they will need to practice! Practice! AND Practice!
2. Value and vocabulary are our first class, every time. This will be review for some of us, but it will be new information for others. It is important for the class to have a basic understanding for success! We will draw a simple still-life in pencil.
3. Choose a subject. We will discuss how to choose our own subject.
4. We will create a drawing with a scratchboard!
5. We will create prints using linoleum blocks! What is a print? Let's look at some art from Hatch Show Print.
6. We will learn about Michelangelo and his love of painting and sculpture. We will view some of his greatest works of both sculpture and painting. Of course, we will be viewing the Sistine Chapel! This will build knowledge of art and community as well as vocabulary.
7. We will create a sculpture from clay!
8. We will learn about Vincent Van Gogh and his most famous works of art.
9. We will create art using watercolor! We will frame our watercolors.
10. We will use pastel and make gorgeous sunsets!
11. We will do a tempera paint pour!! This is so exciting!!
12. All lessons are open-ended, meaning that we start with an art concept or art history fact and are learning those, but we finish as individuals! We are all so different, and so it reflects in our art expressions.
